Historic preservation specialists manage change in the physical environment, working with other disciplines and engaging stakeholders. This course presents the origins and development of the historic preservation movement and discipline (also referred to as heritage conservation) both domestically and globally. Course content will include project case studies, interviews with preservation professionals and assignments that encourage participants to document and advocate for historic preservation within their chosen community.

Course participants will examine the historical and theoretical underpinnings of historic preservation and explore the discipline's relevance to contemporary practice through the following themes:

- Diversity, inclusion and racial justice
- Affordable housing and density
- Climate change and resilience
- Interdisciplinary collaborations
- Practice methods and trades training
- Incentives and innovation
