Course participants will join in the Envision Resilience Narragansett Bay Challenge, sponsored by ReMain Nantucket in partnership with the Florida Climate Institute. Students will serve as preservation planners for a multidisciplinary, multi-university project to develop innovative solutions for climate impacts on the historic Bay communities. The project will consider the region's history and changes over time; risk and vulnerability of social, cultural and built resources; community engagement and communication; and the intersections of design, development and land use, drainage and infrastructure, soils and ecology. The teams will identify the threats, research case studies, and propose adaptive solutions using historic preservation and planning tools, building and urban landscape design, environmental, engineering, and communication strategies.

This project will include the following topics:

- · History and development patterns of the study areas
- Context study including the character of the built environment structures, streets, and land settlement patterns
- Polices and regulations; including existing or potential historic districts under the jurisdiction of the Historic Architectural Review Board, Historic Preservation Master Plans, and state and /or federal laws and regulations that may have an impact on the area including the National Environmental Policy and National Historic Preservation Act.

Coursework includes weekly class sessions, a field trip to Rhode Island, and attending scheduled Zoom lectures by topical experts with partner University students and faculty.
